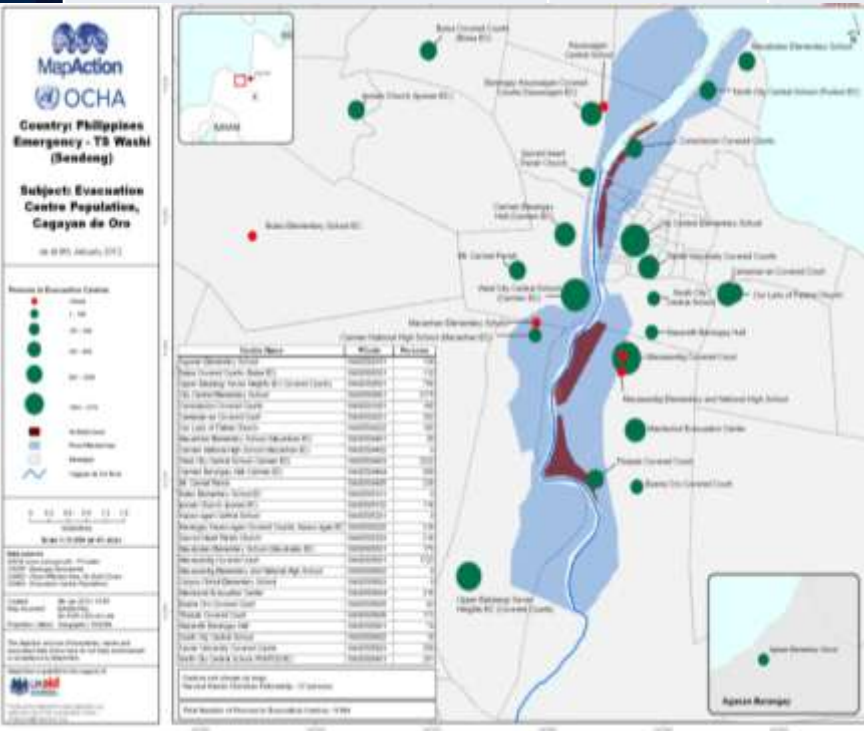

Clusters Response and Challenges

1. Shelter/ Camp Coordination and Management/ Food and NFIs

(Lead: DSWD; Co-leads: IOM, UN-Habitat and IFRC)

- Need to provide temporary/ transition shelter for 11,047 families in Iligan & CDO (do not yet include families who are prohibited from going back to the No-Build Zones)
- Iligan City: 15.4 ha. land was identified by the City government as site for permanent shelter.
- CDO: over 200 families were allowed to move to the Calaanan relocation site starting Jan. 5, 2012

Action Plan for Shelter Solutions and Decongestion of Evacuation Centers (initiated by OCD, endorsed by the Inter-Clusters Response group)

- Criteria for prioritization of families for transitional shelters? relocation and other assistance (**with due consideration on IDPs outside of Ecs for also interventions**)
- Prioritization list of families for the systematic provision of assistance on shelter
- System for information & data management, and analyzing gaps

2. WATER SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WaSH)

(Lead: DOH; Co-lead: UNICEF)

- Focus: improving access to water, sanitation and hygiene for over 238,000 affected people.
- Construction of toilets, bathing spaces and laundry areas in evacuation sites including Calaanan.
- Continuing provision of portable toilets despite constraints in limited dislodging capacity.



- The hygiene promotion technical working group, with DOH, City Health Offices and partners had standardized messages and improved coverage.

Gaps/Constraints:

- Additional water trucking and dislodging capacity required in CDO and Iligan to ensure adequate water and latrine supply.
- Rapid up-scaling of installation of WASH facilities in transition and relocation sites.

3. HEALTH CLUSTER

(Lead: DOH; Co-lead: WHO)

- Extended a total of **PHP23,059,053.38M** worth of logistical assistance
- Activated Surveillance in Post Extreme Emergencies and Disasters (SPEED) in all evacuation centers
- NBI implemented the protocol for the management of the dead and missing
- Continuous monitoring and support for mental and psychosocial wellness, reproductive health, nutrition, as well as water sanitation and hygiene (WaSH)
- Massive prophylaxis against Leptospirosis in government health centers, hospitals/ health facilities and private institutions

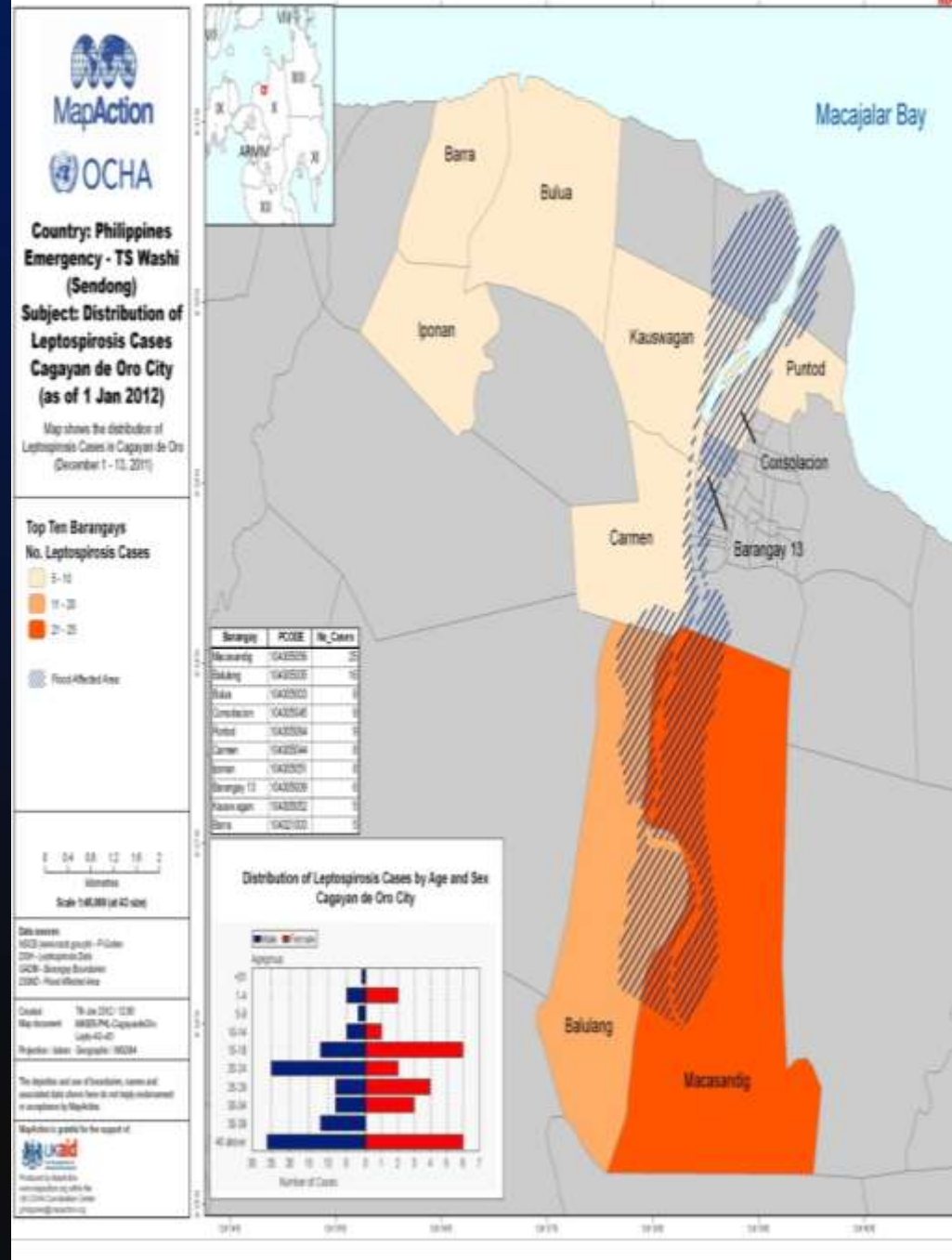
Leptospirosis Outbreak in CDO and Iligan City

Leptospirosis Outbreak declared by DOH

- 1. Jan 1, 2012 - Cagayan de Oro
- 2. Jan. 5, 2012 - Iligan City

Total 377 cases, 16 deaths

✓ No more new cases/
admissions for Leptospirosis
as of 07 January 2012



PSYCHOSOCIAL INTERVENTION

- Continuous Stress Debriefing sessions including counseling, and live entertainment by visiting celebrities
- Availability of Psychotropic Drugs in hospitals and evacuation centers
- Needs: Additional psychiatrists from professional organizations and private hospitals to provide adequate mental health and psycho-social support.

4. LOGISTICS CLUSTER

(Lead: OCD; Co-Lead: WFP)

- Establishment of the One Stop Shop facility for acceptance and processing of foreign donations per NDRRMC Memo No. 13 dated 23 Dec 2011
- Continuing transport of goods (tents and NFIs) from Manila to CDO, from CDO to Iligan.
- Provision of warehouse/ storage for food and NFIs at DSWD and 4 ID Camp Evangelista. Additional storage space also made available in Iligan to assist the clusters in their storage needs.

5. Education Cluster

(Lead: DepEd; Co-leads: UNICEF and Save the Children)

- Ongoing Damage and Needs Assessment of all affected schools to determine cost for immediate recovery and rehabilitation
- Continuing decongestion of Schools used as ECs by transferring IDP families to barangay covered courts, chapels and tent sites

6. Nutrition (Lead: DOH; Co-lead: UNICEF)

- Conducted breastfeeding classes in EC's for 16 pregnant and lactating mothers.
- Received medical and nutrition supplies from UNICEF
- Continuing assessment, counseling and interventions for malnutrition cases among IDPs

7. Food Security

(Lead: DSWD, Co-Lead: WFP)

- Extended a total of **PHP122,303,007.41M** worth of relief assistance from the combined resources of the NDRRMC, DSWD, DOH, NGOs and LGU
- Food distribution complemented by food for work schemes and emergency school feeding programs.
- Needed Interventions: food distribution and food for work schemes to families outside of ECs, particularly those staying with host families.

8. Protection including Child Protection and Gender Based Violence

(Lead: DSWD; Co-leads: UNHCR, UNICEF, UNFPA)

- The Protection Cluster supports 36,500 extremely vulnerable individuals
- The Child Protection Cluster targets another 200,000 individuals.
 - Capitol University Medical city CDO (2)
 - Maria Reyna hospital, CDO (6)
 - XU Community Health center, CDO (1)
- The GBV sub-cluster aims to support 100,000 individuals

Challenges: Congestion in ECs; no community-based child protection network; increasing threats for child abuse and gender based violence.

OFFICE OF CIVIL DEFENSE

- ✓ Rice assistance augmentation worth PHP 1 Million
 - ✓ Provided a Total of PHP 2.690 Million Financial Assistance to 275 death Claimants in Iligan and CDO and Injured victims in CDO
- >> 10, 000 each burial assistance and
5,000 each medical assistance to the injured

Needs -As of 11 January 2012:

PHP 680,000 ASAP for 160 death claimants and 19 injured, documents processed already.

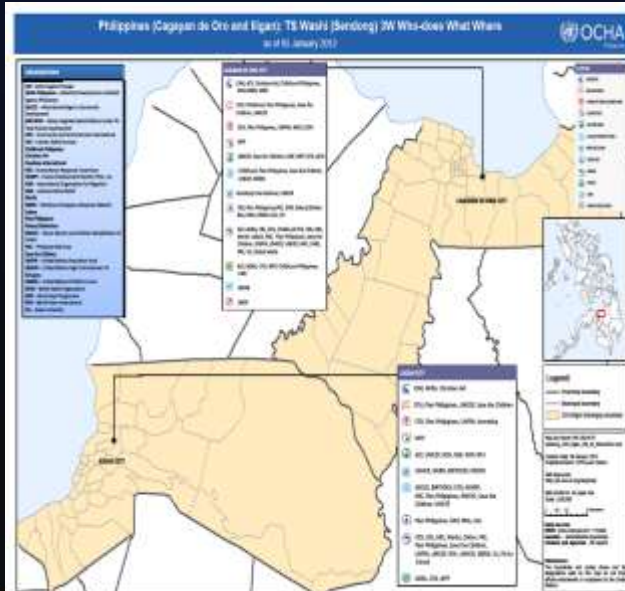
For provision: PHP 5,050,000 for the remaining 505 Identified dead (Tot. 768; Death from Leptospirosis Not yet included)



COORDINATION

(Lead: OCD; with support from OCHA)

- Establishment of TS Sendong Response Coordination Center at DSWD as coordination and information hub
- Working group on food and cash for work initiatives has been established with DSWD and ILO. Way ahead: conduct of next phase assessments to feed into the PDNA and DALA
- Information management support (analysis and IM tools e.g. thematic and situational maps)



FUNDING

- **\$19.3 million**: from foreign governments, Filipino communities (source : DFA)
- **\$7.22 million**: through the Flash Appeal (CERF, Japan, ECHO, USA and Spain)
- Food and Non-Food assistance

REQUIRED INTERVENTIONS FROM THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT

- Presidential pronouncement/ directive for LGUs to provide “suitable” land/ sites for permanent relocation following the identification of “No-build” Zones.
- Support LGUs in implementing DRR programmes (geo-hazard mapping/ assessments, early warning systems, and community-based response preparedness).
